I used a stamp I had purchased at the super show to 'push' color around with the Copic pens. That class I would take again just to play with all the Copic colors. The airbrushing with the pens is something I would like to continue pursuing, fun, fun, fun.



Sunday night was a retailer's class with Paulette Jarvey of Hot Off The Press. Paulette is such a gracious person whose family has been in the industry for over 30 years. We made 12x12 page layouts and greeting cards using papers from the Little Prints and Patterns book, Pop-Ups All Occasion Card Kit, and their latest Dazzles double sided stick sticker designs. We were moving fast and furious to complete all the projects within three hours.



The next class was with Sherrill Kahn in Resist Techniques: Texture and Pattern. Sherrill has been in Art forever as she is a retired Art Teacher who loves color, color and more color with texture. She is very vivacious and you are not allowed to enter or leave her class without a hug. I used product I had no knowledge of and it was wonderful. We waxed, scribbled, painted and did it all over again adding another element.



I never played with chalk as I did with Art Journaling with Ingrid Dijkers. We got down and dirty rubbing the chalk deep into the chipboard pages. After that, we had to find images and journal on the chalked surface. I got one page completed.



Celebrating You was a blast and very swift moving with Marah Johnson. The journal kit was filled with colorful pages and fun embellishments. The best part was coloring with Creative Imaginations Luminarte daubers. True to Luminarte the colors are very vibrant and glitzy. We colored everything, the chipboard, all the flowers, paper ribbon, wood paper and the pages themselves. Needless to say I kept the table cover to create a collage project.



I am excited to introduce two new lines to our store; 7 Gypsies and Elizabeth Designs. I was blown away with the creative possibilities with these two companies. A small shipment of the 7 Gypsies came in and we sold completely out of the Binderie before I returned from CHA. This is a great tool to have in your arsenal. I attached another order to the next shipment arriving in a couple of weeks.

Elizabeth Designs had very beautiful and elaborate outline sticker designs that caught my eye and held my attention. Her card samples just blew me away, the glitter she applied was ultra fine, glitzy and sexy. Whew, I had to have it and you are going to have so much fun designing with Elizabeth Designs!!!!!! Here are 2 samples with 1 design;



The fish was peeled off and applied to a double stick sheet. Mica powder was applied and the image was then cut out and adhered to the card stock and embellished further with a flower vine from Prima. The kanji paper made for a beautiful Asian card layout.



This card layout was so easy using clear acetate and applying the fish, flowers, bubbles and happy birthday greeting. I used the Copic markers to color in the flowers and fish and also colored a few of the flowers on the card stock to give a little more depth. The bubbles have Swarovski crystals for a wee bit of glitz.
